COMMUNICABLE DISEASE PREVENTION

Making Camp Safe for Everyone



In order to prevent a major communicable disease outbreak at camp, Victory Ranch has implemented the following recommendations:

No one having an influenza-like illness (ILI) in the 7 days preceding camp is allowed to attend a summer camp program. All campers will be screened during check-in.

Campers who have been recently exposed to a communicable disease (such as influenza) but have no symptoms may attend but should self-monitor and report any symptoms immediately to the camp's First Aide Director. Campers exhibiting symptoms will be separated from the general camp population until their parent or guardian can pick them up or they are taken for medical care.



While at camp, all campers and staff are to follow good hygiene practices, including washing their hands frequently with soap and warm water, covering their mouth when they cough or sneeze, and not sharing personal belongings. Among other things, the camp will continue to clean doorknobs, faucets, handrails, and other surfaces daily.
