

VICTORY RANCH DRESS STANDARDS

Our goal at Victory Ranch is to teach our campers about Jesus Christ, to teach them who He is, what His work has accomplished, and how we should live for Him. We recognize the importance of our example as camp staff in the teaching process. Campers learn as much from what they hear as from what they see.

The Bible clearly teaches that men should dress, act, and behave like men; and that women should dress, act, and behave like women. As staff it is essential that we set the example by dressing, acting, and behaving like godly men and women and in a neat and modest manner. Therefore, in addition to camper dress standards, all Ranch staff will abide by the following guidelines:

1. Modesty is to be modeled at all times. Tight-fitting clothing, low-cut necklines, dresses that do not reach the knee, and shorts with an inseam less than 4" are not permitted. Regarding swimsuits: we ask guys to not wear tight trunks, or cut off jeans and girls not to wear low neck or high thigh suits or suits with a bare midriff. Please be aware of suits that do not have linings or are not made from appropriate materials. Worldly fads in clothing and hairstyles are out of place at Camp. Our purpose is to model heavenly citizenship, not worldly (Titus 1:12; Jas. 4:4; I Tim. 2:8-10)
2. Clothing should be neat and clean. Dirty work clothes are not to be worn to services. Please be conscious that the clothes fit the occasion.
3. Caution should be exercised in wearing slogans and patches.
4. Men cannot wear women's clothing and women cannot wear men's clothing. No "uni-sex" clothing.
5. Hairstyles for men may not look feminine and hairstyles for women may not look masculine. Staff may not be outside of their cabins in robes/night clothes.
6. Women are not to wear strapless, halter, or tank tops. Undergarments are to be worn at all times.
7. No bare midriffs and no baggy pants are to be worn. Staff must be able to bend over, reach, etc. without showing skin or exposing one's undergarments. Clothes and posture (standing, sitting, and bending) are to be modest and appropriate.

These guidelines are not intended to codify what will be required in every conceivable case; they are an attempt to apply relevant Biblical principles to a specific setting and that is the summer staff ministry at Victory Ranch. A desire to live within Biblical principles will result in the willingness of the staff member to accept these guidelines while working at Victory Ranch. The Director will interpret and apply Biblical principles for any occasion not specifically covered by these guidelines.
