

In the early 1980s, I was teaching a 4th grade boy's Sunday School class at Bethel Baptist Church in Torrance. I was also teaching a Good News Club in the city of Pico Rivera as part of my student ministry for Biola University. The Child Evangelism Director for that area asked me to serve as a counselor for one week that summer at Camp Good News in the San Bernardino Mountains. Before I had a chance to go to Camp Good News, my pastor called and asked if I would serve as a counselor for one week at Victory Ranch. I agreed. The thing that struck me most about serving as a counselor was the many opportunities I had to share the gospel. Sometimes it can be a challenge to start a conversation with someone about the gospel, but in the camp setting, we were able to lead devotions morning and evening, as well as answer questions the speaker may have raised during the chapel services that day. I remember calling Gordon Nicholson, the camp director, after my second week of counseling to ask if he needed help the rest of the summer . . . and so began my ministry at Victory Ranch.

When we are not running our own programs, we allow other churches of "like faith and practice" to use the facilities. This has greatly increased our ability to see this facility impact the world for Christ as those churches share the gospel with the attendees that they bring to Victory Ranch. However, ministry doesn't stop there. Sometimes God brings other

people to our door who need to hear the gospel. I remember a woman and her young daughter coming to our office door. By appearance and her own admission, she had lived a "hard life." As we talked, she said that she had been searching for God and sheepishly admitted to taking a Bible from a motel

She said that she was ashamed about that but had been reading it. I told her if she would read it and place her faith in trust in Jesus Christ, none of the Gideons would be upset and that they would gladly replace the Bible. I went through the plan of salvation with her, and before she left, she said she had placed her faith and trust in Jesus Christ.

As I was talking last week to Heidi Gott, our missionary speaker for the Spanish portion of our Spring Ladies' Retreat, we discussed crime in South America. I told her of a young man from the Netherlands who stopped by the Ranch this past June. A recent college graduate, he had flown into LAX with his bicycle and saddle bags two days before and was headed to Mexico and then onward to South America. He shared that his parents had recently divorced, and he claimed to be an atheist. I shared the gospel with him, and before he left, I gave him a small, light-weight Bible and asked him to read it on his trip. He readily agreed. I have not seen him again but pray that he too found Jesus Christ in his travels.

Whether through our own camps, rental groups, or other opportunities that God gives us along the way, we praise him for using Victory Ranch to spread the good news of the gospel. As we enter another year, please keep our camps and retreats in your prayers so that many more people may hear and come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ.

Mini Camp gives a unique opportunity for children too young to attend a full week of camp to experience a day in the life of a camper. Each child may bring one parent/ guardian along. Many of the parents/ guardians who attended last year were excited after seeing Victory Ranch for the first time and asked about summer camp for their older children. WEST. WEEK

June 16-21 is the scheduled date for our annual Work Experience Staff Training (W.E.S.T.) Week. Eighth through twelfth grade young people with a heart for ministry may apply. "West Weekers" will learn how to work in the camp kitchen and be given the necessary information to pass a Riverside County Health Department food handlers test. They will also learn housekeeping skills, how to run the cash drawers in the Snack Shoppe and General Store, how to saddle a horse, how to properly use a bow and arrows, and much more. Mornings are spent cleaning the camp's grounds and facilities, and afternoons are spent in training. We have a chapel time each evening, as well as recreation and games. Based on each West Weeker's performance, attitude, aptitude, spiritual maturity, etc., individuals will be selected to join our volunteer summer staff for our weeks of camp in July. Those selected to serve on staff will be expected to attend the camp Victory Ranch offers for their age group, giving them the opportunity to be on the receiving end and benefit spiritually from being in attendance at one of our camps. Those interested in participating should contact the Ranch office for a multi-page application and reference forms. Once the application and references are submitted/ returned and have been reviewed by the camp director, each applicant will have a phone interview to determine suitability for the program.

HORSEMANSHIP CAMP

This year, our Horsemanship Camp will be held on **July 7-10**. This is a basic horsemanship camp and will teach participants how to groom, saddle, and care for a horse. In addition to daily trail rides, there will be classes on horse colors and breeds, tack and equipment, and more. This camp is limited to the first 18 people in 4th through 12th grades who sign-up and pay. This camp often fills up as soon as registration opens online, before publicity even goes out.
