NEW CABIN PROJECT

On Friday, December 13, our contractor, two of their employees, our architect, our grading contractor, and the county inspector met at the fire circle for a pre-construction meeting. We should have our grading permit in hand next week; however, this doesn't mean we will break ground immediately. We still have much to do. The septic system for Maverick and, unless God intervenes, the Bunkhouse will have to be redesigned. Tumbleweed, the cabin across from the shop, will need to be removed along with some trees. Please keep this project in your prayers.

FREE AND ALMOST FREE FIREWOOD

"What's the difference?" you may ask. Free firewood is in a pile behind the hill and can be immediately loaded into your vehicle. Some pieces are bigger than others. The "small stuff" usually disappears first. Almost-free firewood you may have to do a little work to get. We have some giant Eucalyptus rounds that are too big to lift and will need to be split in place. We also have a few dead trees on the property that need to be dropped and cut up. The limbs will need to be piled for chipping, and you take home the pieces you cut. Call the Ranch to schedule a time to pick up your firewood.

TESTIMONIES

During summer camp a number of years ago, two men stopped by the Ranch. They explained that they had met at Camp Victory/Victory Ranch as teens in the registration line for Senior High Camp and had become best friends. They had kept in touch through the years, and when one needed to go to Hemet for business, he called the other and invited him to join him.
