Each year I begin contacting our counselors and staff to get commitments for Summer Camp. Some years it is easier than others. Only 2 of our 25 counselors were not returning staff/counselors. We had pastors from 5 of our GARB Churches involved this summer; Pastor Phil Wozniac (Calvary Baptist Anaheim), Pastor Jay Gauthier (First Baptist El Monte), Pastor Kim Gaston (So. 

BONFIRE BONANZA


